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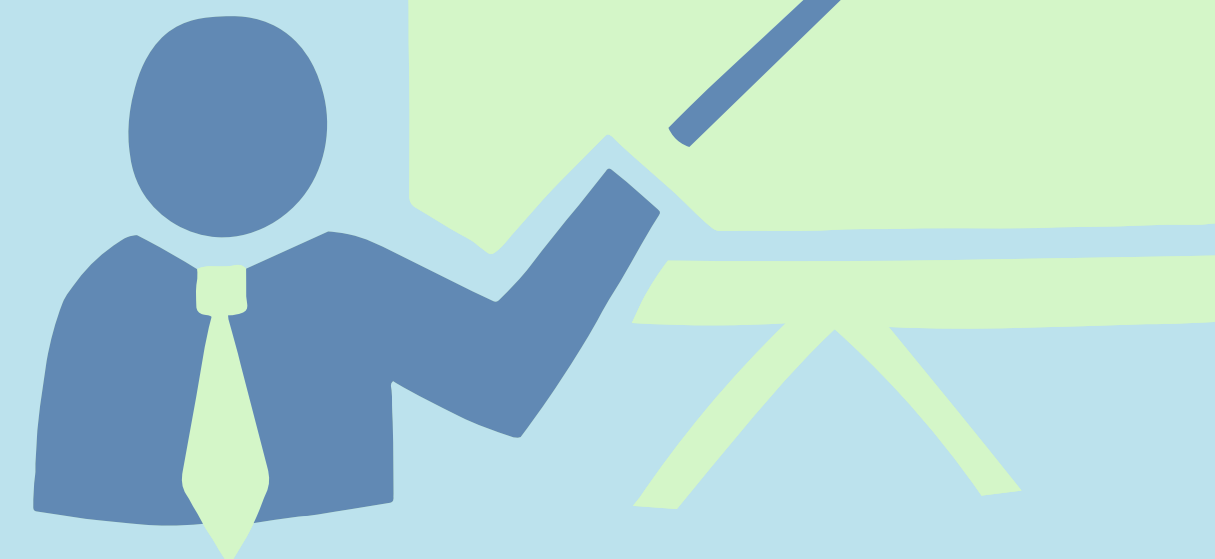
How to help people use digital tools and web opportunities with awareness and recognize manipulated information and fake news

# Interdisciplinary collaboration



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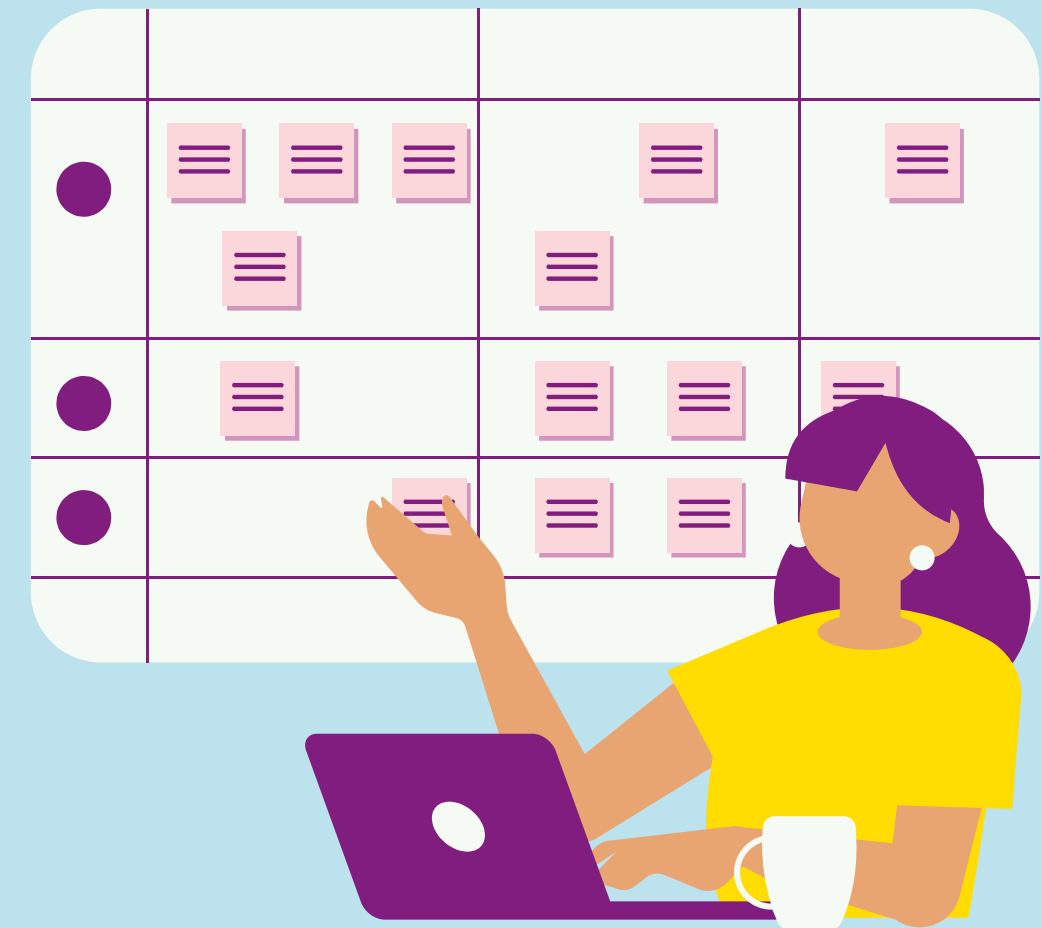

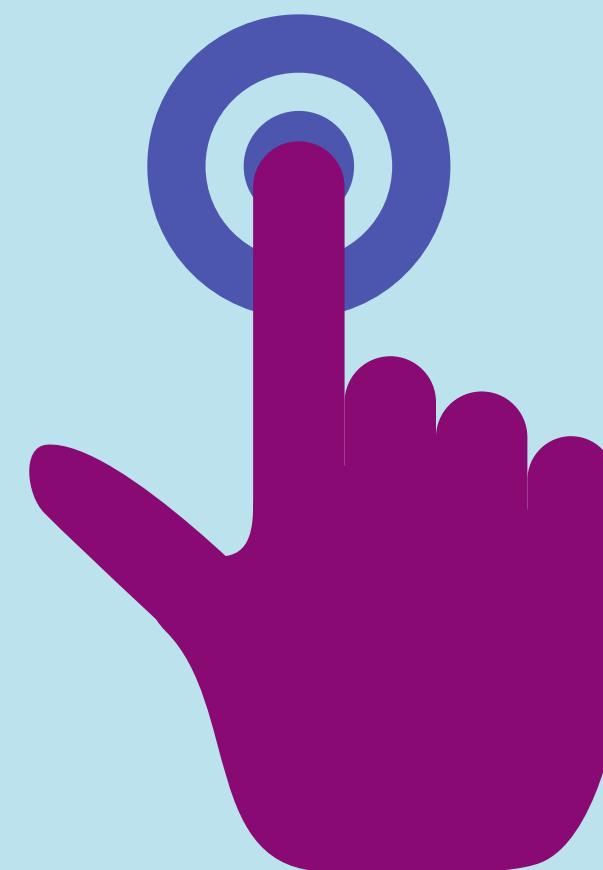




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# Collaboration with digital platforms
