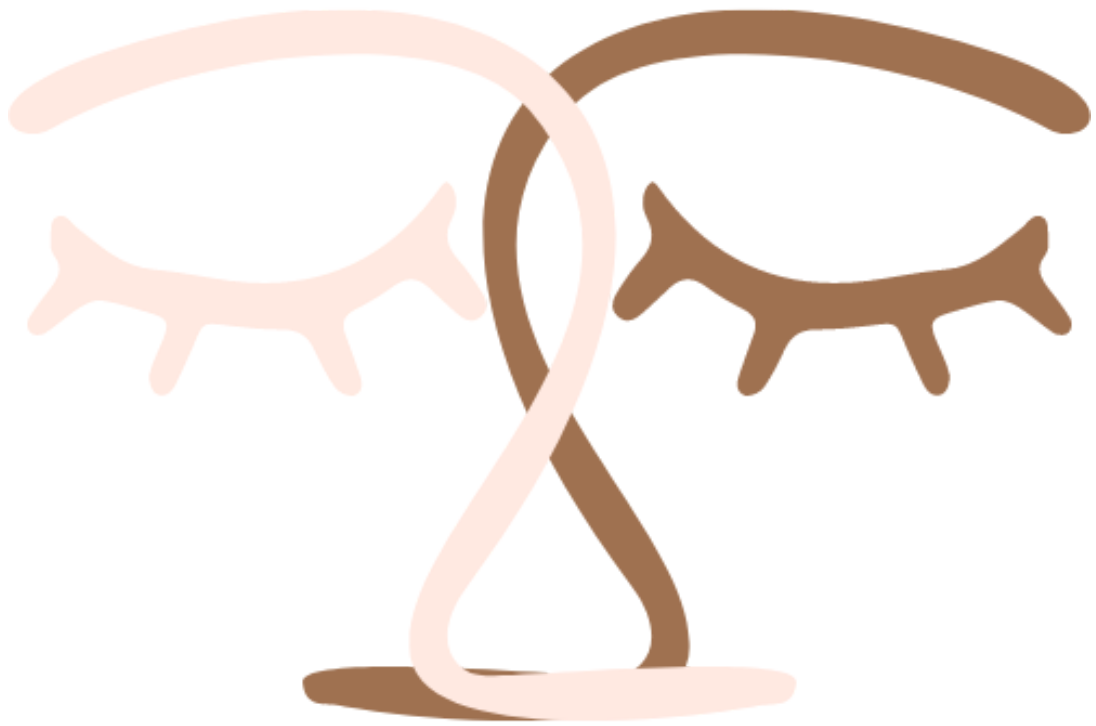

# COLLABORATION AND PARTNERSHIPS

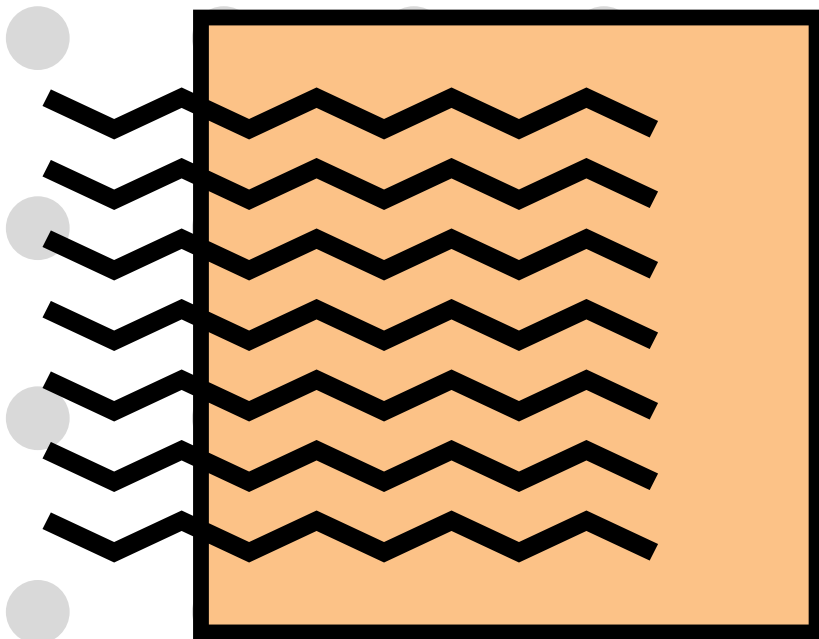
Foster collaboration between governmental institutions, civil society organizations, and migrant communities to develop and implement integration strategies.
